# **Volunteer Spotlight**



Meet **Mirage Memmer** and her son, Levi. Mirage is a Meals on Wheels Driver and a Frozen Meals volunteer. Mirage grew up volunteering and was taught the value of serving at an early age. This is something she wanted to pass on to her son, Levi, who is 5 years old. She wanted to teach him kindness and to be resourceful with his money. Being a military family and living all over, she and Levi decided at each station they would choose a place to volunteer. At one particular nursing home, they would visit the 'grandmas and grandpas' to pass out candy. They both decided to make Candy Cane grams for the Frozen Meals clients during the Christmas holidays. Since Levi is a visual learner, he could compare the two experiences. Levi was given \$15 for the Candy Cane Gram supplies and had to make it stretch over 120 clients.

She wanted to show him there is more in the world than his own family. Mirage enjoys being a weekly Meals on Wheels driver. She looks forward to seeing and visiting with the clients each week. Mirage knows that one of the benefits of being a Meals on Wheels driver is making sure the client is safe and OK - a safety check for their family. She mentioned with enthusiasm that when she broke her hip in May 2018, one of her former route drivers came to visit her in the nursing home while she recovered. They also mailed her a Christmas card and gift that year.

Fun fact: Helen is related to Rosa Parks. Milliner's father, Thomas Williamson, was a relative of Ms. Parks and helped Ms. Parks and her family move to Detroit, Michigan shortly after the Montgomery Bus Boycott ended. When Helen's father passed away in 1987, Ms. Parks attended his funeral. Helen describes Ms. Parks as "an all-around nice woman".
